Meet On Return Home

Sgt. Charles A. Green and his brother, Pfc. Edward W. Green Jr., sons of Anna H. and the late Edward W. Green Sr., met recently at the family residence, 724 Broadway. The brothers, both veterans of the European Theatre of Operations, had not seen each other since February, 1943.

Edward Green, who holds the Presidential Unit Citation awarded for the heroic and outstanding work of his squadron during the Battle of the Belgium Bulge, left the States in March, 1944. In addition to the unit citation, he holds the ETO ribbon with five battle stars and the Good Conduct ribbon. He served with the 40th Fighting Squadron of the 9th Airborne.

Charles Green served with the Infantry Replacing System, placing men with the First, Third, Fifth and Ninth Armies. He holds the ETO ribbon with two battle stars and the Good Conduct Medal. Charles completed his training at camps in Florida, Georgia and the Carolinas. He is married to the former Miss Betty Bednar.

Charles has in his possession a P-38 German pistol and Edward presented his mother with a German Gold Cross, which was given to a German mother for having eight sons in the German Army. The two soldiers will return to service camps to await discharge, Charles to Indiantown Gap and Edward to Seymour Johnson Field in North Carolina.
