Mrs, John Steiner, 429 Cedar Street, Allentown, and Mrs. John Cernobyl, 838 North Penn Street, Allentown, received telegrams yes-terday from the War Department to the effect that their sons are alive and safe, although prisoners of the Italian government. The sons, Privates William E. Stei-ner, 23, and Cyril Cernobyl, 22, had previously been reported missing in action in Northwest Africa as of December 24 and 23, respectively. With the fate of these two soldiers known, all of nine Lehigh County soldiers reported missing in the same theater of war on the same days have been accounted for. One of them, Mitchell Montz of Stiles, has since been reported killed in action. All others are prisoners of the Ital-All others are prisoners of the Italians. FEB 1 8 1943
