PARRIS ISLAND, S. C.—“In the know” on a recruit’s favorite subject, Marine Private Marie Curry sees to it that a couple of hundred recruits get where they want to go, when they want to go and that they know just how much it will cost them to get home.

Once a week, every week the Rail<sup>o</sup> Transportation office here is filled with recruits, who have finished their “boot training” and who are ready to spend ten days taking life easy. Private Curry is the disbursing and rail transportation clerk in that office and she has all the dope on railroads, their junction points, fares and times of arrival on the tip of her tongue. Her job is to

see that each recruit gets to his home the quickest and cheapest way.

Before entering the Marine Corps Women’s Reserve in November, 1943, Private Curry was an employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company in the metallurgy department. She is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Curry of 514 Avenue, Bethlehem. (Pvt. Curry is expected home on a leave today.)
