Corporal Harryn is a veteran of the bloody and famous battle for Cibik's Ridge on Bougainville Island. The Corporal's commanding officer for whom the battle was named has just left this hospital

after receiving treatment.

"It was a bloody and fierce battle but the Marines came through in great style," said the youthful Leatherneck. "I'm darn sorry that I'm still not over there with my

buddies helping out on all other ridges, hills and islands that have to be taken."

Corporal Harryn, a son of Mrs. Joseph Harryn of 226 Adrian Street, Bethlehem, has seen service at many overseas posts. Among these are Samoa, New Zealand, New Caledonia, New Hebrides, Guadalcanal, Bougainville, Sella, Munda, and Munda. **APR. 3 1944**
