Schaffer of the Aberdeen Proving Grounds, son of Mr. and Mrs. Francis Schaffer of 169 Washington Avenue, Bethlehem, at 4 p. m. Saturday, in St. James' Lutheran Church. Rev. Raymond J. Heckman, pastor, read the service.

Reynold Peters gave an organ recital and Robert Brobst was vocal soloist.

The bride wore an ivory brocade gown with a soft peplum and full-shirred skirt. A Juliet cap held the finger-tip veil. She carried a prayer book topped with an orchid.

Betty Gangwer, sister of the bride, and Hilda Schaffer, the bridegroom's sister, were the attendants. Miss Gangwer wore a Sierra blue taffeta velvet gown, while Miss Schaffer's gown was of California claret. Both wore head-dresses of ostrich tips which matched the bouquets of yellow chrysanthemums and roses.

Earl Schaffer, brother of the bridegroom, was best man, and ushers were Richard Gangwer, brother of the bride, and John Bessemer, of Bethlehem.
