For defending ms plane through
continued enemy fighter plane attack and enabling the pilot to reach
and score a direct hit on a Japanese
warship, Kenneth J. Lock, aviation
machinist's mate second class,
USNR, son of Henry Lock, 138 Pennsylvania Avenue, Bangor, has been
commended posthumously. He was
reported killed at sea November 15,
1943.

The citation, made by Admiral C. W. Nimitz, USN, commander-inchief of the Pacific fleet, was given "for meritorious and efficient performance of duty as aerial gunner of a torpedo plane during a strike against Japanese shipping in Rabaul Harbor, New Britain, November 11, 1943."
