Arthur Neuman Awarded AAF Legion Of Merit

With the receipt of the Legion of Merit Medal from the Army Air Forces headquarters for services performed in that command between January, 1943, to June, 1945, Arthur Neuman, 1213 Sioux St., Fountain Hill, will become the only enlisted man to be given the award with 11 officers named for the honor early last month.

Given for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding services, the citation with the award to Neuman reads in part: "Master Sergeant Arthur

Neuman clearly demonstrated his unusual and outstanding leadership and instructional ability and served brilliantly as a special instructor of administration and internal organization. His contribution to the training of tactical units of the Air Technical Service Command reflects great credit upon himself and the Army Air Forces.

At various times during the time indicated he was stationed in 45 of the 48 states on duty in the personnel division of ATSC. He was discharged as a master sergeant.

Neuman, who sells shoes for a Quakertown firm, is the son of Mrs. Anna Neuman who is also living at the Sioux St. address, home of Mr. and Mrs. Max Levitz, after turning her former home, 318 Pawnee St., over to the Federal Public Housing Authority because of the current housing emergency.

He has three brothers, Dr. M. Neuman and J. W. Neuman of Bethlehem, and Samuel Neuman of Allentown and one sister, Mrs. Levitz of the Fountain Hill address. Neuman received the medal last Thursday.
