**T/4 Camillo DeFulvio
Gets Army Discharge
After European Duty**

T/4 Camillo D. DeFulvio, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carmine DeFulvio, 630 Hayes Street, was recently discharged from the U. S. Army at Fort Wadsworth, N. Y.

Having been in the service for three and one-half years, he spent 20 months overseas in the European Theater of Operations and fought in North Africa, Sicily, Salerno and Italy with the 34th Infantry Division.

T/4 DeFulvio was wounded in the fighting for Cassino and was hospitalized in Naples, Italy. After recovering, he was sent home to the States in June, 1944, and to date has been stationed at Fort Wadsworth, serving with the Second Service Command. He holds the Purple Heart, Good Conduct Medal, Presidential Unit Citation and ETO ribbon.

The ex-soldier is 24 years old and is a member of Holy Rosary Church. Before entering the service, he was employed by Bethlehem Steel Company.
