135 Local Men Accepted for Military Duty

One hundred thirty-five men from Selective Service Board No. 1 were accepted for service in the armed forces yesterday at Allentown Induction Center. One of the largest contingents to be taken from a single board, it included one of the highest percentages to be accepted by the navy, a total of 69. Fifty-nine were accepted for the army, and six for the Marine Corps.

Men who had not been listed by the Induction Center when the Globe-Times went to press yesterday afternoon were Joseph Csandli, Marines; George C. Halljan, army; Frank R. Hrijanak, army, and Theodore R. Hicks, navy, and Steve M. Domitrecz, navy.

Names misspelled in yesterday's list were Zoltan M. Albert, John J. Cengari, Joseph J. Buonassi, and Fred B. Rooney, Jr., all of navy; John A. Ulincy and Michael Zuk, of army, and Stephen M. Posivak, Marines.
