One Sworn in Today at Hotel
Bethlehem—Two to Train in
Iowa, Third in Oklahoma.

Three girl employes of the First National Bank and Trust Company, of Bethlehem, Pa., have enlisted for service with the Women's Auxiliary Volunteer Emergency Service, U. S. Navy women's auxiliary war force, it was learned today at the bank.

One of the three, Miss Pearl Hiegley, 1532 Easton Avenue, this city, was sworn into that organization today here in Hotel Bethlehem by Lieut. (j.g.) John C. Sullivan, U. S. Naval Officer Procurement representative.

Miss Hiegley, who graduated from Liberty High School with the class of 1938, was formerly employed as an operator by the Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania. She has been employed by the bank as a teller for the past two years. She enlisted January 8 and will train at the WAVES general school in Cedar Falls, Ia.

The other two bank employes who have enlisted are Miss Mary Frances Wright, 719 North Hoffert Street, Fountain Hill, and Miss Carmila Petraglia, Nazareth, R. D. 1.

Miss Wright, a graduate of Fountain Hill High School with the class of 1937 and of the Bethlehem Business College secretarial course in 1939, has been employed by the
