

TWO FAMILIES HAVE EIGHT SONS IN ARMY

The Stewart Uhlers and Dominic Fimianos Have Four Each in Service.

Two Northampton County families have the right to display service flags with four stars. Mr. and Mrs. Stewart F. Uhler, Nazareth R. D. 3, and Mr. and Mrs. Dominick Fimiano, 122 North Warren Street, Easton, boast of having four sons, each in the service. All the boys are in the Army.

Of the Uhler quartet, Private First Class Wilbert S. Uhler, was first to be called on March 14, 1941, is serving in the coast artillery at Ledericksburg, Va. The youngest of the four, he was employed at the Crown hosiery mills in Bangor before entering service.

Private Clayton F. Uhler, second to go, whose wife is the former Eaythe Wilson, of Pike County, is serving in the infantry in the Panama Canal Zone. Clayton, who is the father of an infant son, entered service September 24, 1941, and received basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga. He also worked for the Crown hosiery mills.

Private Walter C. Uhler, who was inducted April 29, 1942, is serving the ground crew of the air force at Jackson, Miss. He served basic training at Keesler Field, Miss., and is the third to have worked at the Crown Mills.

Private George W. Uhler, the oldest and last to be called, entered service last November 5, at New Cumberland, and is currently receiving basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga. He was formerly employed at the Bethlehem Steel Company and was a resident of Fountain Hill.

Mr. and Mrs. Fimiano's son, Private Frank Fimiano, celebrated the first anniversary of his entrance into service last Wednesday. He has arrived safely at some destination overseas, according to word recently received by his parents. A graduate of Easton High School, Class of 1937, he was employed at Easton Winding Company before beginning active duty.

Private Anthony L. Fimiano is attached to a medical detachment at Keesler Field, Miss. He has been in service for over four months.

Private Chester Fimiano, who was inducted less than a month ago, is undergoing basic training at Fort McClellan, Ala. He attended Easton High School and was formerly employed in local silk mills.

Corporal William Fimiano, who entered service with Frank is a member of an infantry unit at Atlanta, Ga. He is a graduate of Easton High School, Class of 1938
