## Quakertown Man Killed In Plane Crash In California

Corporal Russell Harry Allison of Quakertown, turret gunner on a B-27, was one of five airmen killed in a crash which occurred on Saturday evening, 7 p. m., California time (10 p. m., our time), five miles from March Field in California where Corporal Allison was stationed. March Field is 40 miles north of Los Angeles.

Corporal Allison, 22 years of age, was the son of Russell L. Allison of 22 North Fourth Street, Quakertown, an employee in the Quakertown Post Office, and the late Alice L. Biehn Allison. He entered the Air Corps in February, 1941. After graduating from Quakertown High School in 1939 he was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company until the time of his induction.

Surviving are his father and one sister, Miss Mae Elizabeth Allison,

a student at Jefferson Hospital. He was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church, Quakertown. His body will be sent home and funeral arrangements will be announced by W. A. Treffinger, North Ambler Street, Quakertown, funeral director.
