Charles S. Satterthwait, former student at Lehigh University, and well known civil engineer in this area, is now Captain Satterthwait of the U. S. Army Engineers and is located "somewhere in Alaska."

In a recent letter to friends he speaks of the need for engineers where he is located and tells that the soldiers put in extra hours and work seven days a week. "In more than a year now these men have not had a day that they could really call their own," he wrote. The captain praised the food, clothing and quarters which Uncle Sam provided for the cold weather.

Captain Satterthwait left Lehigh University during World War I to join the American Friends Reconstruction Unit for service in France but he refused to be classified as a conscientious objector.
