

WILL HELP GET JOBS FOR EX-SERVICEMEN

Selective Service Board No. 2 Chief Hears from Stuart Hockenbury.

As chairman of Bethlehem U. S. Selective Service Board No. 2, with headquarters in the Bethlehem Trust Building, E. H. Thevenet yesterday announced he had received a letter from Stuart E. Hockenbury, Hotel Bethlehem manager, offering the hotel's full cooperation and that of its affiliated company in the matter of getting jobs for veterans returning from the war.

Chairman Thevenet, recently moved to this position from the job of acting board chairman, said

Hockenbury expressed willingness to hire veterans in cooperation with the draft board's task after this war of helping returning war veterans to secure employment.

This future task, in which all the nation's draft boards will assist, will include aid in getting jobs for soldiers wounded in action and unable to return to military service. The hotel, Hockenbury said, will help in every way possible to replace these men in civilian life.

Recalled in the letter, Thevenet pointed out, was the plan followed by English and French hotels after the first World War of doing the same thing for returning veterans, many of whom wore their medals on uniforms they later wore in civilian jobs.
