**1st Sgt. Oliver W. Young,
Nazareth, Discharged
After Three Years**

First Sergeant Oliver W. Young, 122 South Green St., Nazareth, has returned home following discharge from Indiantown Gap on Wednesday, after three years of service, including duty in Germany and Japan with the 97th Infantry Division.

First Sergeant Young entered service Feb. 25, 1943, and received his basic training at Camp Swift, Tex. Following training as a surgical technician he was sent to France and then to Germany and Czechoslovakia. He returned to the States in July, 1945, and after a 30-day furlough, was shipped to Japan, where

he served with the occupation forces.

He wears the Good Conduct Ribbon, European Theater of Operations Ribbon with one battle star, Asiatic-Pacific Ribbon, American Theater Ribbon and Victory Ribbon.

Prior to entering service, Young was employed as produce manager in the A. & P. Super Market, Bangor. His wife is the former Miss Mary Sheler and his mother, Mrs. Steward W. Young, resides at 503 South First St., Bangor. **MAR 1 1946**
