**Lt. C. Y. Haas**

**Receives Bronze  
Medal For Valor**

Lieut. Carstens Young Haas of Bethlehem, was awarded the newly authorized Bronze Star Medal with the Oak Leaf Cluster for meritorious achievement in connection with military operations by his commander, Major General A. V. Arnold of the Seventh Infantry Division, in a ceremony held recently at a Central Pacific base.

Lieut. Haas was presented the decoration in recognition of his outstanding actions during the battle for Attu in the Aleutians a year ago, as assistant Provost Marshall.

A veteran of two campaigns in the Pacific war, Haas received the Oak Leaf Cluster in lieu of a second Bronze Star for his excellent work prior to and during the assault and capture of Kwajalein atoll, center of Jap-held Marshalls, early this year. He was an assistant in the G-4 Section of Division through the battle.

A graduate of Liberty High school in Bethlehem in 1934, Haas attended Lehigh University and graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemical Engineering, in 1938. Before his entry in the Army he was employed as a Petroleum Refining Engineer by the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey, at Elizabeth, New Jersey. He is a member of Tau Beta Phi, honorary fraternity and Chi Phi.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis C. Haas of 419 W. North Street, Bethlehem. His wife, Mrs. Lois A. Haas and their young son, Richard, live at 17 Raymond Terrace, in Elizabeth, New Jersey.
