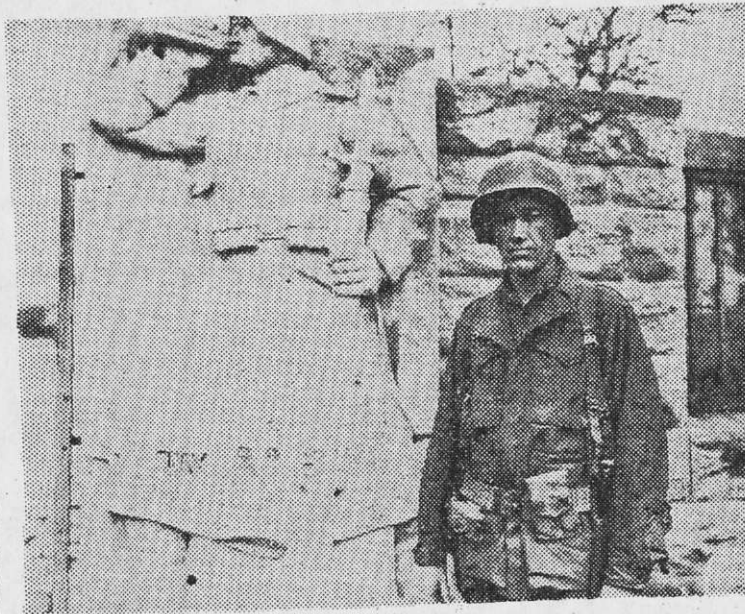


Bewley, Loyal V.

### Col. Bewley: Front Line Fighter



WITH THE XII CORPS ACROSS GERMANY—Well known to front line infantrymen is Lt. Col. Loyal V. Bewley of Bethlehem, Operations Officer with Major General Manton S. Eddy's XII Corps which has just cut Germany in two. Lt. Col. Bewley is famous for his frequent visits to the actual front lines and has become favorite of the XII Corps GI Infantryman because of his resourcefulness and daring.

When the XII Corps made the first assault crossing in history of the Rhine River near Oppenheim, March 22nd, Lt. Col. Bewley crossed in the assault wave with his old outfit, the 5th Infantry Division, with which he served during the last war.

Twice decorated in this war, once with the Silver Star and once with the Bronze Star, Lt. Col. Bewley has been with the XII Corps during its

sweep across France and across Germany.

The picture shows Lt. Col. Bewley at the gate of the Meiningen kaserne where the XII Corps captured the complete German files of Allied Prisoners of War.

In civil life Lt. Col. Bewley headed the Electrical Engineering Department of Lehigh University. His home is at 1454 Main Street, Bethlehem where his wife and two sons are living.
