Man Who Lost Limb in Africa Arrives Home

Corporal Willard H. Heiserman, veteran of the North African campaign, came home last week to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Heiserman, Bethlehem, R. 3, for a visit of two weeks.

He lost his left leg and part of a finger in the Tunis area last October, was decorated with the Purple Heart, ribbons for good conduct and the European campaign and was transferred to the United States for hospital treatment.

Also home on furlough are his brother, Private George A. Heiserman, in service at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, and cousin, Sergeant Harry A. Ritter, son of Mr. and Mrs. Leroy Ritter, Allentown, R. 60.

George Heiserman was granted a furlough of 12 days to meet his brother at home. The cousin brought with him his recent bride, Fave Durbin, of Shreveport, La.
