ceived the first message from the War Department that their son was wounded on May 6 in action, were told since by Mr. and Mrs. Harry Webb, of Broadway, that their son, Harold Webb, who is also serving Uncle Sam in North Africa, had come across Paul, and that on May 6 he was wounded in the leg by a piece of shrapnel, but not seriously. Corporal Jani was graduated from Liberty High School in June, 1941. After his eighteenth birthday, Jan-uary 23, 1942, he was inducted into service, being sent first to Phila-delphia and then to Camp Wheeler, Ga. In May, 1942, he was sent over-seas to England and Ireland. ^{*} His troop was the first to be sent from Ireland to North Africa. Mr. and Mrs. Jani have another **Son**, Francis, 21, who is in the ser-vice, stationed at Camp Campbell, Ky. He was inducted into the ser-vice December 28. 1942.
