#### MOTOR POOL DISPATCHER

Pfc. Paul R. Schreiber, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Schreiber, 717 Center Street, is a member of the U. S. Army Air Corps, but he's pretty much "grounded" these days for he is acting as a dispatcher for a motor truck pool somewhere in Alaska.

Schreiber enlisted in the Air Corps in the early part of September, 1942 and was sworn in at 11 a. m. the 20th of the month. By 4 p. m. he was enroute to New Cumberland. After a few days at induction center, he was sent to Las Vegas, N. M., for basic training and it was there he became acquainted with the army's motor transport, learning to drive everything from the jeep to the ten wheel drive jobs.

Early in January of this year he left Las Vegas for Edmonton, Alberta, Canada and from thence was sent to Alaska. He was advanced to private first class at that time.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Brewster Aeronautical Corp. at Hatboro, where he was a specialist in hydraulic brakes.
