



your friends to cheer on the school are just a few ways students display their school spirit through Category 6. Even if the football team loses a game, everyone still has fun coming together to cheer on the team.













HOMECOMING GAME



















COMPETITION CORNER





SADD CRASH a scary reality



"No, it wasn't actually real," commented one student. "But the fact is, it's so realistic. Things like this actually do happen, especially with kids my age." On a sunny day in May, eight Liberty seniors participated in the SADD drunk driving simulation that occurs every other year. SADD, which is led by Mrs. Prodes, received help from St. Luke's Hospital and the Bethlehem Police to create a very life-like and realistic video that depicted the outcome of the drunk driving accident. Seniors Heather Grant and Matt Tkacik were both pronounced dead in the simulation. Grace Walters was paralyzed from the neck down. Ryan Brong, the perpetrator of the

crash, received a sentence of at least six years in jail. The remaining students were emotionally scarred from the experience. Juniors and seniors attended the 'funeral' for Matt and Heather the following day, where a former alum of Liberty spoke about her own experience with car accidents involved with drunk driving. Parents of the deceased or injured students wrote letters to the perpetrator, describing the pain and loss that they felt. The SADD Crash luckily was not real, but it successfully depicted the loss that Liberty would feel if such a horrible event were to really happen.
