## Stephen Silvoy Reported Dead By U. S. Navy

Stephen Andrew Silvoy, apprentice seaman, United States Naval Reserves, son of Mrs. Johanna Silvoy of 806 Hayes Street, has made the supreme sacrifice, according to information received by his mother from Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox.

According to the information, he was travelling in a passenger status

on board a merchant ship when that vessel was sunk as a result of being torpedoed without warning on the morning of February 7. This action occurred in mid-Atlantic.

Known as "Shorty," he joined the Navy last October, and received his boot training at the Great Lakes Naval Training. He was subsequently transferred to Long Beach, N. Y. He attended Bethlehem Catholic High School, and Bethlehem Technical High School.

Besides his mother, he is survived by a brother, Pvt. George Silvoy, U. S. Army; a brother, Francis, of Bethlehem, and a sister, Mrs. Margaret Oravec.
