HARRY HARCHAR NOW WEARS CAPTAIN'S BARS

Promotion Revealed in Letter
—Is On "Stars and Stripes"
Staff in Africa.

Commissioned a second lieutenant prior to December 7, 1941, when he joined Uncle Sam's army, Harry Harchar, son of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Harchar, 316 West Fourth Street, now wears a captain's uniform, according to information received by friends in Bethlehem.

A graduate of Liberty High School, class of '31, and of Lehigh University, class of '39 he was part of the first convoy of U. S. soldiers to land in Ireland. For some time afterward, he served as associate editor of the Stars and Stripes, the publication of the A. E. F., and was quartered in London.

According to information embodied in his letter, he was among the sizeable force that landed several weeks ago on African soil. He is presently associated with the editorial staff of the Stars and Stripes, "somewhere in Africa."

During his collegiate days at Lehigh he was a member of the Brown and White staff. While at Bethlehem High School, he captained the swimming team, and was a member of the school's track team. He was also long actively identified with the local Boy Scout activities and held numerous honors in that organization.
