## Sgt. Triglani, Roseto, Killed In Germany

JAN 2, 1945

Word was received yesterday morning by Mr. and Mrs. Antonio Trigiani of Garibaldi Street, Roseto, that their son, S. Sgt. Albert Trigiani, of the United States Army, was killed in action in Germany on Dec. 11. He was a member of the First American Army.

He enlisted in the armed forces through the National Guard in January, 1942, and received basic training at Indiantown Gap Military Reservation. He received further training at numerous camps throughout the southern part of the United States and went overseas in September, 1944.

Besides his parents, he is survived by the following brothers and sisters: Pvt. Romeo Trigiani in France; Cpl. Raymond Trigiani at Fort Jackson, S. C.; Pfc. Rudolph Trigiani, who was wounded in action in France, now at Atlantic City, N. J.; Nicholas Trigiani of Los Angeles, California; the Misses Tessie, Edith, Irene, Gloria and Charmaine, all at home, and Mrs. Helen Figlioli, of Rangor.
