J., after spending a 10-day furlough at home. He received his commission in the United States Naval Reserves January 3, 1944. He trained at the U. S. Naval Training Station at Sampson, N. Y., prior to being transferred to Princeton, N. J. He is a graduate of Liberty High School, class of 1936, and also graduated from Moravian College Class of 1940 where he was director of the school's Glee Club, editor of the College Year Book, "The Revista" and was selected "Who's Who in American Colleges."
