### Two Local Airmen Get AAF Discharges

Staff Sgt. Johnny Tulba and Tech. Sgt. William Seaman, two veteran Eighth Air Force men from this city, were honorably discharged from the service at the Newark Army Air Field Separation Center.

As a crew chief on a B-17 airplane with the 385th Bomb Group, Sgt. Tulba served in England for two years. He received the ETO Ribbon with six battle stars, the Bronze Star, Unit Citation with one cluster and the Good Conduct Medal.

The separatee is the son of Paul Tulba, 1615 Columbia Street. His wife, the former Miss Sophie Waslik, lives with his father. Before entering the service, Sgt. Tulba was a structural worker for the Bethlehem Steel Company where he intends to return.

A radio operator gunner with the same bomb group, T/Sgt. Seaman served 10 months in England, France and Germany. His awards include the ETO Ribbon with four battle stars, the Unit Citation, Air Medal with three clusters and the Good Conduct Medal.

Seaman is the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Seaman, who live at 317 Laury Street. His wife, the former Miss Margaret Ammand, lives at 546 Ontario Street. Before entering the Air Corps, he worked for the Bethlehem Steel Company. He plans to take advantage of the opportunities afforded him under the GI Bill of Rights by attending Lehigh University, where he will study accounting.
