**Pfc. A. Lubensky, Northampton,  
Is Reported Killed In Action** <sup>AUG 4</sup> 1944

Pfc. Alex Lubensky, son of Mrs. Mary Lubensky, 1835 Canal Street, Northampton, was reported killed in action June 9.

In a message from the War Department which read "It is with profound regret that your son, Pfc. Alex Lubensky, is reported killed in action in England."

Pfc. Lubensky was inducted September 2, 1942, and received his basic training at Fort Bragg, N. C., and Camp Gordon, Ga. He participated in both the Sicilian and North African campaigns and came through both campaigns safely. He was sent to England in November, 1943. The young soldier was 23 years old and was a member of Blessed Virgin Ukrainian Orthodox Church, Newport. He is survived by his mother, two brothers, Stephen and Michael, and a sister, Anna, at home.

The last letter to his family was received in May, 1944. He was in service 21 months and had never been home on a furlough.
