John J. Nemeth, Of Coast Guard, Dies of Wounds

John J. Nemeth, 23, Electrician's Mate Third Class, U. S. Coast Guard, died of wounds received in action, according to information received by his parents, John and Elizabeth Nemeth, of 1215 Mechanic Street.

On August 13 of last year, his brother, Petty Officer Second Class Victor Nemeth, U. S. Navy, who was home on leave, was killed in a motorcycle accident near Leithsville.

In a letter to his parents dated January 2, the former stated that he was feeling fine and he expected a respite in the near future. During the Christmas season, he sent presents to all of the members of his family.

According to the information received, he was wounded in action "somewhere in the South Pacific" during an engagement. Overseas for the past 18 months, he participated in most of the major engagements.

He enlisted in the Coast Guard in 1942, and following his boot training at Sampson, N. Y., he was sent overseas. He was a graduate of Bethlehem Technical High School, class of '40, and a former employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company. He was a member of St. John Capistrano's Church and graduated from the parish parochial school.

Besides his parents he is survived by three brothers, Pvt. Joseph Nemeth, U. S. Army, stationed in Colorado; Frank and Alfred, at home, and four sisters, Mrs. Helen Gubich, Bethlehem, and Elizabeth, Mary and Anna, at home.
