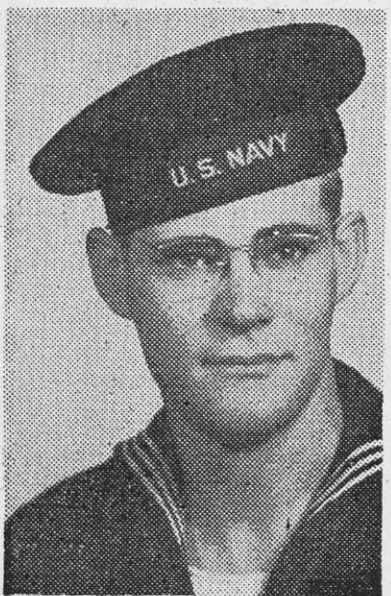

Mrs. Leslie Greenfield, 264 Wall Street, has four sons in the armed forces. Their father is the late J. J. Greenfield, former Assistant Fire Chief.

Staff Sergeant Frank G. Greenfield served two enlistments with the infantry in the Philippine Islands, and began his third enlistment, February, 1941, with the Medical Corps at Fort Meade, Md. He received further training at Camp Blanding, Florida, and Fort Bragg, North Carolina, being sent overseas July, 1942. He has served in the African, Sicilian and Italian campaigns.

Petty Officer, 2nd Class, Joseph J. Greenfield, is now a special fireman, second class, and is stationed at Great Lakes Naval Training Center. He received his boot training at Camp Peary, Virginia, and was sent to Boston, Massachusetts, for special fire-fighting training. Before entering the Navy in October, 1943, he was a lieutenant on the Bethlehem Steel Fire Department.

Robert Greenfield, Petty Officer 1-c, prior to entering the Seabees in July, 1943, was employed in the Engineering department of the Bethlehem Steel Company. Upon completion of boot training at Camp Peary, Virginia, he received the rating of Petty Officer 2nd class, and was sent to an advanced base at Port Hueneme, California. December, 1943, he was sent overseas and now "Somewhere in New Guinea," where he qualified for promotion to Petty Officer 1st class effective May 1, 1944.

His wife, the former Bernadine Leiderman, and daughter, Sandra live at 260 Wall Street.

Corporal James T. Greenfield is in the Army Air Forces. He received his basic training in Greensboro, N. C. but later was transferred to Amarillo, Texas, where he graduated from Air Mechanic School. He was sent to Kingman, Arizona, where he recently graduated from Aerial Gunner School and received his silver gunner's wings and was promoted to the rank of corporal. At present he is stationed at Lincoln, Neb. Before entering the service in August, 1943, he was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company.

He is married to the former Wanda Zatocky.
