Gets Awards

AN EIGHTH AIR FORCE BOMBER STATION, Eng.— Staff Sergeant Charles E. Miller, tall gunner of the B-24 Liberator, "Lady Grace," at this Eighth Air Force station, has completed 39 missions over France, Belgium, Germany and Holland, and has been awarded the Air Medal with five oak leaf clusters for "extraordinary achievement in aerial flight while serving with distinction on numerous and frequent operational flights over enemy occupied Continental Europe."

Sergeant Miller and other members of his crew were cited for their "courage, coolness and skill in the face of determined opposition." "Their actions," the citation continues, "reflect great credit upon themselves and the armed forces of the United States."

Before entering the service in September, 1943, Sergeant Miller was employed as a sheet metal fitter for the Mack Manufacturing Co., Allentown, Pa. He completed gunnery school at Harlingen, Texas, and arrived in the European Theatre of Operations last June.

Sergeant Miller is the son of Mrs. Irene Fegley of Route 1, Bethlehem. His wife, Mrs. Annie E. Miller, lives at 929 South 6th Street, Allentown.
