Pfc. George A. Wiley, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Wiley, Hill-side Avenue, was awarded the Bronze Star Medal "for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on April 6, 1945 in the vicinity of Buschlutten, Ger-many." During a two-day patrol behind enemy lines, Pfc. Wiley, together with his companions, successfully at-tacked artillery positions and two night tank bivouacs, caus-ing confusions amongst the enemy and gathering valuable information concerning instal-lations. Pfc. Wiley's courage and devotion to duty reflect great credit on himself, his or-ganization and the military serv-ice. A former fotoball star at Liberty High School. Pfc. Wiley

Wiley played tackle on the varsity eleven during the 1935, 36 and 37 seasons, subsequently filling the same position at Allentown Preparatory School and Frank-lin, and Marshall College. He was inducted May 6, 1941 and after several months of train-ing in the States, was sent over-seas in 1943. Pfc. Wiley partici-pated in the D-Day invasion and fought through all the major European campaigns with the First Army. He was wounded in action in Germany May 8, 1945.
