Bombardier Missing in Action Now Reported Dead By Nazis

Reported missing in action over Germany January 19, 1944, by the U. S. Army Air Forces, Lieut. Morris S. Friedman, bombardier, was said by the Red Cross to have lost his life. Word of Lieut. Friedman's death was received by the Red Cross through the German government, which stated that the Bethlehem airman had died January 7.

Lieut. Friedman was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Herman Friedman, 438 Webster Street, and husband of Alice Stubbs Friedman, who resides at 1823 Maple Street. She is the daughter of Mrs. W. G. Bickel. Mrs. Friedman became the mother of a son, David Allen, December 21, 1943. Her young husband had never seen his child.

Lieut. Friedman was a bombardier in the 8th Airforce. He received his wings June 3 and was sent overseas the early part of December, 1943.
