Pen Argyl Soldier 25 1945
Dies In Carolina

Pfc. Clarence W. Kindt, 406 North Robinson Avenue, Pen Argyl, died at Camp Butner, N. C., Thursday, aged 34 years. Born in Belfast, he was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Kindt. He was inducted into the U. S. Army January 10, 1944. He went overseas to France where he was wounded November 11. He was hospitalized six weeks, returned to duty and was returned to Camp Butner, N. C., where he underwent a sinus operation, which developed into pneumonia and caused his death.

The young soldier was a member of the Zion Methodist Church and chairman of Boy Scout Troop 34, sponsored by the church. He is survived by his wife, Frieda Mutton Kindt.

Funeral services Tuesday, 2 p. m. from the late home in charge of the Rev. Charles E. Wonderly, pastor of the Zion Methodist Church, Pen Argyl, assisted by the Rev. Elmer E. Messersmith, Bethany Evangelical Church, Pen Argyl. Interment will be made in Fairview Cemetery, Pen Argyl.
