Corporal Belgrasch Home On Furlough 24 1944

Corporal Peter V. Belgrasch, after spending a brief furlough with his wife and five children at 517 Itaska Street, leaves today for his assignment overseas.

Since enlisting 21 months ago, he has three diplomas and a Good Conduct medal. He graduated from special training schools at Keesler Field, A. M. School, CVAC, at Lind-

bergh Field, San Diego, and the Municipal Airport No. 2, Tucson, Ariz. While at San Diego, he was assigned as a flying crew chief on a B-24 Liberator.

At present he is assigned to a highly technical B-25 squadron at Key Field, Meridian, Miss.

Prior to enlistment, Corporal Belgrasch was employed at Open Hearth

No. 1 in the Bethlehem Steel Company.

A brother, Sgt. Frank Belgrasch, a holder of the Air Medal, is missing in action after his sixth mission over Germany in December.
