Forming a competent staff was Ted Haas, Managing Editor, who assisted Ray in the editorship and took charge of the individual cuts. The Associate Editors, Ann Romano and Jean Maxwell, were responsible for the write-ups and statistics for each senior, while the Activity Editors, Marguerite Tokar and Florangela Colasante, collected data on the activities, in Liberty High School. Winifred Harte could be seen running around after school to arrange the taking of the pictures on these activities. Helen Nemeth, the art editor, furnished the **Cauldron** with its sketches and lettering. Naomi Knauss, the Feature Editor, provided some of the highlights of the book, among them the class ballot and poem. Sports Editors, Lucille Handwerk and Stanley Zweifel, united to bring Liberty's sports on paper. Ella Sik, Business Manager, used her commercial training to good advantage in the handling of business transactions. The Senior Play was finished, and, as each person left the auditorium on March 15 and 16, he went not only with a feeling of being entertained, but of having received an insight into the life and heart of one of America's greatest women, Harriet Beecher Stowe. For Harriet was no ordinary Senior play: it was the most outstanding production presented by any Senior Class in the history of Liberty High School. Having been produced very successfully in New York during the 1942-1943 season and starring in its title role the great Helen Hayes, Harriet was no simple task to present on a high school stage, and much credit is due the director, Mr. Truman J. Reese. Having recently returned from the Army, Mr. Reese capably cast and directed the actors and actresses who gave the two splendid performances.

Like most productions of its type, this play was not without its complications. The cast has fond memories of rehearsals when lines were forgotten, prompters were not present, properties were lost, and scenes seemed to be becoming worse instead of better.



With available talent and capable reserves from last year's team, Coach Stark's booters looked forward to a successful season.

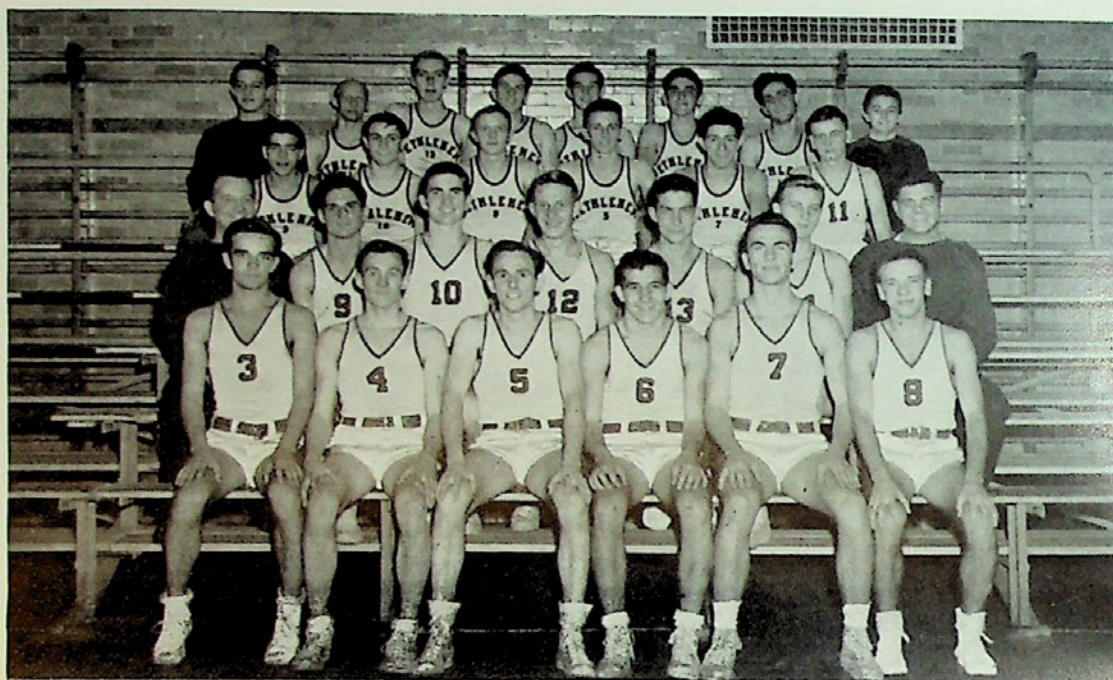

The opening of the wrestling season brought a few veterans and some hard-working boys together in preparation for the 1945-46 wrestling team.

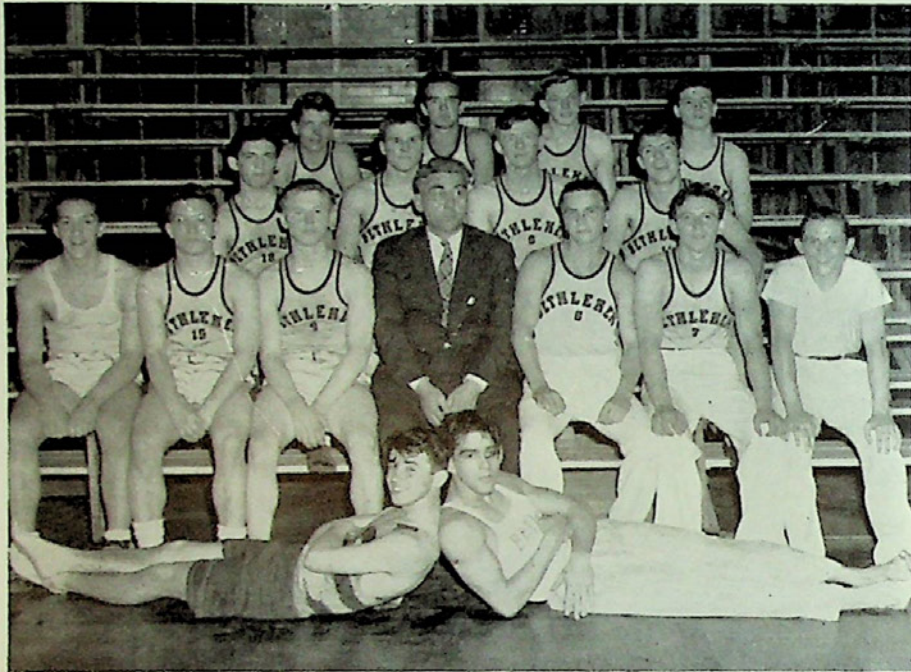

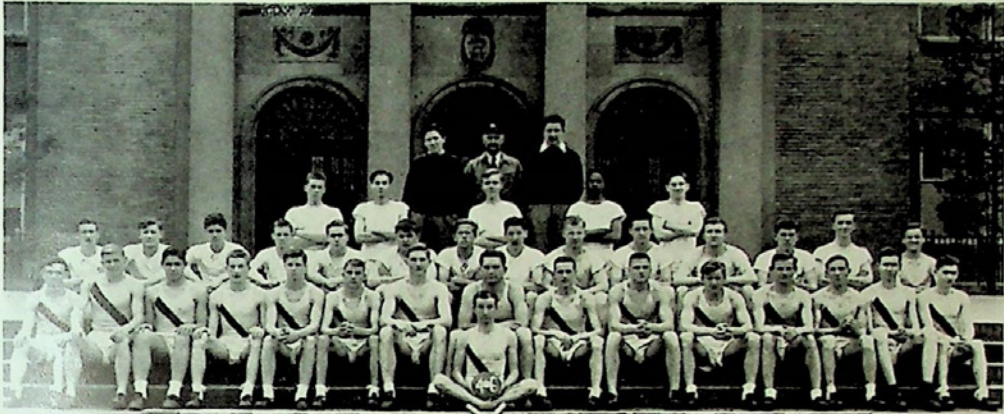

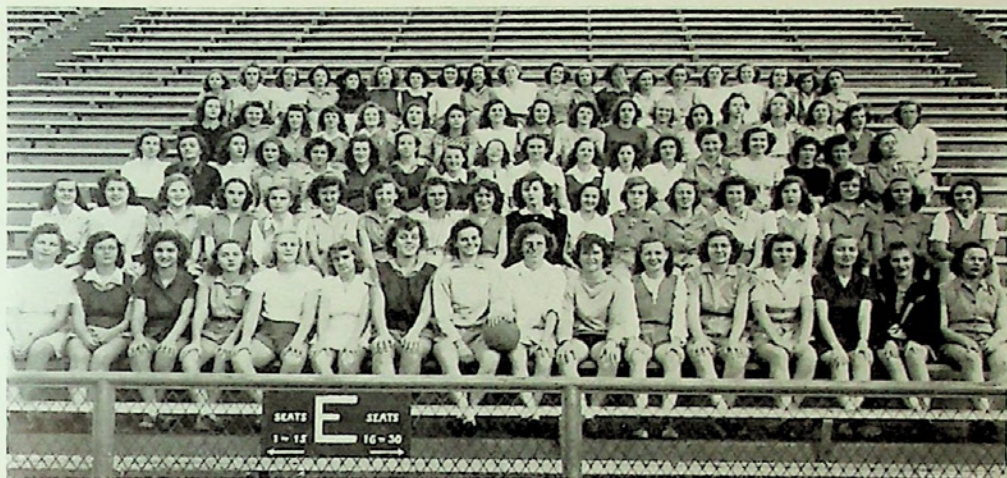

The schedule which began on May 1 continued until the close of school.

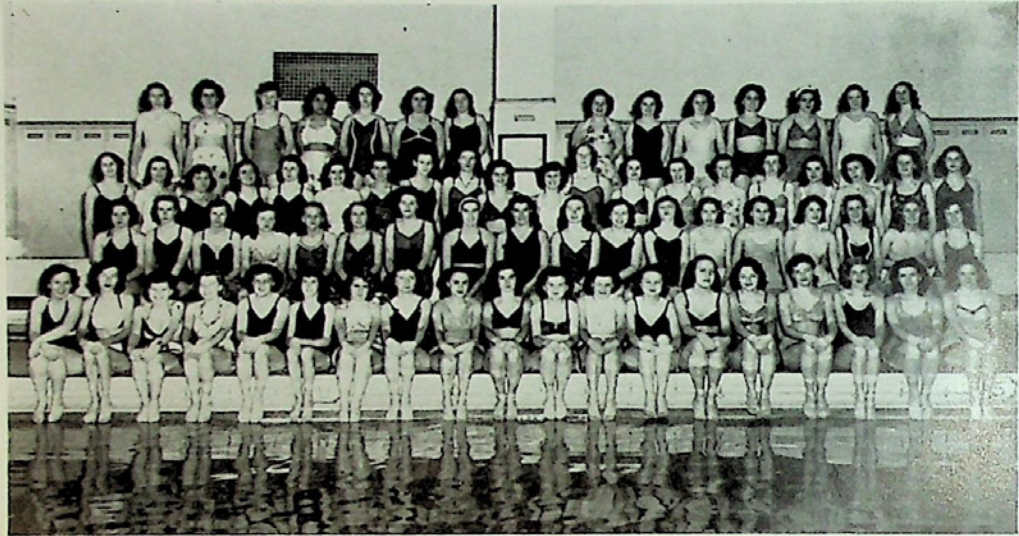

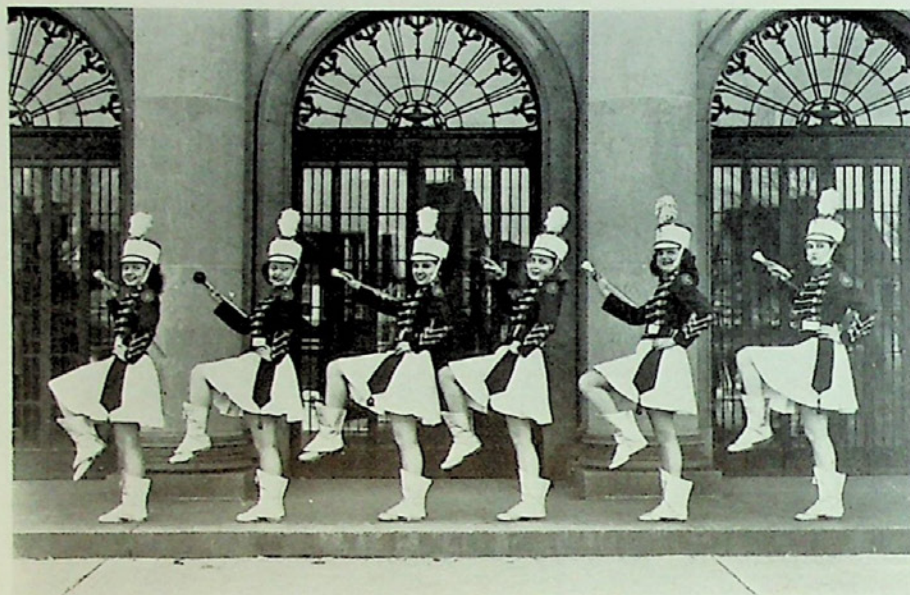

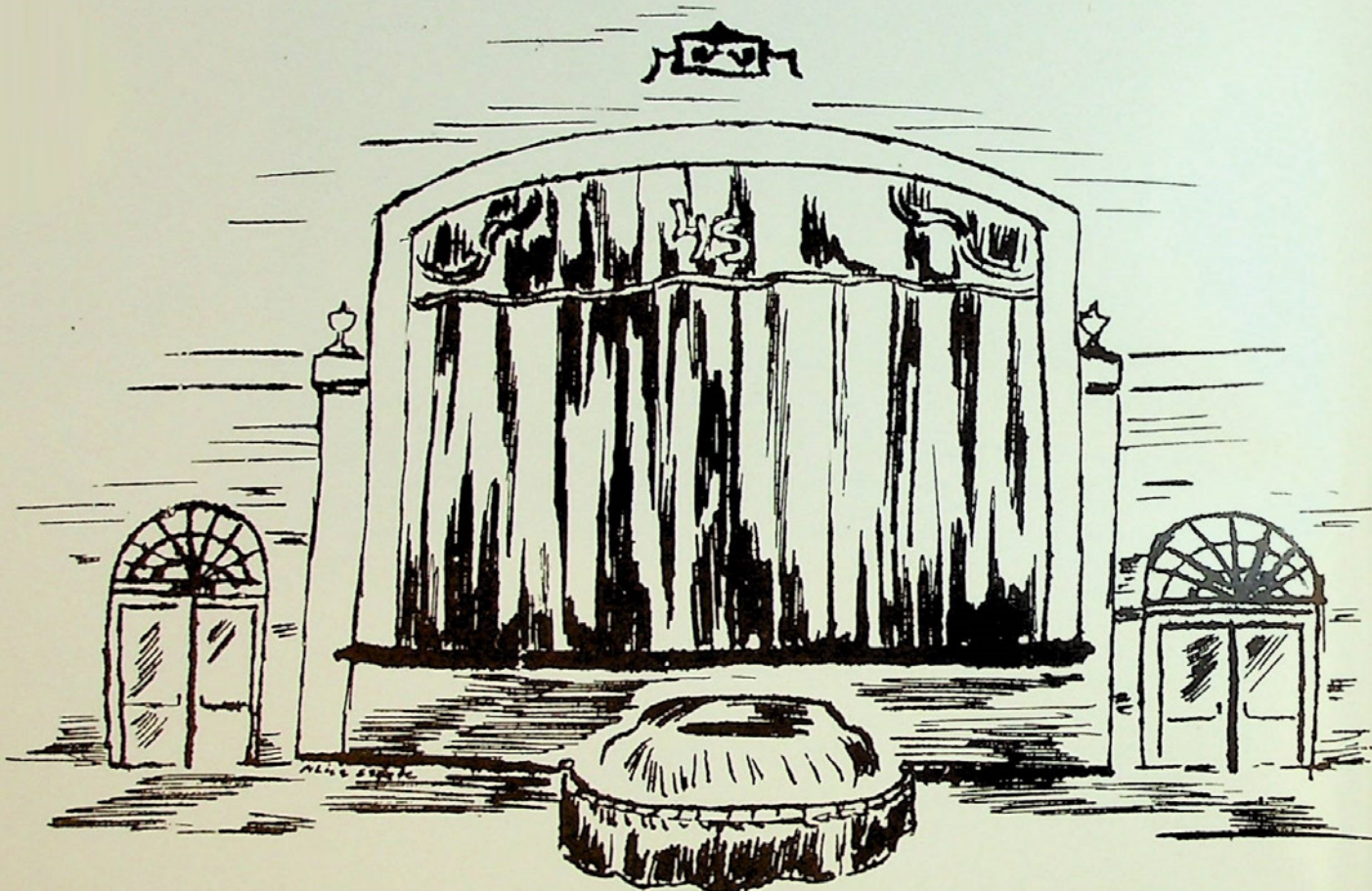

History of the Class of 1946

SOPHOMORE

On Wednesday, September 8, 1943, we green sophomores entered a large building which we knew as Liberty High School. From that time on to the present, we did our best to please both our fellow classmates and our teachers (at least part of the time, anyway).

Later in our sophomore year, we assembled to vote for officers. George LaSasso and Lucille McCorkell held the same offices then as they do now—president and treasurer, respectively. The vice-president was Richard Medlecot and the secretary was Patricia Lawrence. Class dues were set at two dollars. It nearly broke us, but we gave till it hurt.

March 24, 1944 rolled around with the first affair of the season for us. This was the "Paper Bag Party", an invention of Miss Kutz, then our class adviser. The girls brought lunches to this party; the fellows bought them at 25 cents apiece, and ate with the girl whose name appeared inside. There were some strings attached, though. During this year there was quite a man shortage, with girls far outnumbering boys. Thus the boys had more than one lunch to share. But all had a pleasant evening, especially the boys, who finally had enough girls and enough food to satisfy them.

Another class event was the "Sophomore Hop" on June 2, 1944. This time we invited upper classmen to attend. A large number were present, and a good time was the order of the day. Since it was near the close of the term, we exuberantly looked forward to our long summer nap; but inside we wistfully waited for the first day of our junior year, when there would be some new sophomores for us Juniors to tease.

JUNIOR

When you recall your high school days in future times, by all means do not underestimate the value of your Junior year. I grant you, the Sophomore and Senior years will be remembered as the most exciting; as Sophomores, everything was new and strange, while as Seniors, we are "old timers" and are out to make everyone aware of our importance. Four little Junior year is sandwiched in between those other two dominant ones; her history remains hidden and practically forgotten.

Therefore, to give credit where credit is due, allow me to review some of the highlights of the year 1944-45. First of all, it was in our Junior year that our class achieved the unity which culminated in our accomplishments as Seniors. While Sophomores, we still thought of each other as coming from Franklin, Broughal, Washington, Nitchsmann, or some other school. But during our Junior year, by gaining new friends and intermingling, we finally gained harmony.

As soon as we became unified, it was comparatively simple to exert our influence for the benefit of the school. Our class always had an abundance of leaders with good ideas, one of which was the Student Government. Former pupils at L. H. S. had attempted to interest the faculty and student body in the Student Council, but apparently there had been a lack of interest and enthusiasm. Likewise, members of our class tried to put the idea across, and thanks to the cooperation of both faculty and students, the plan is finally bearing fruit. Another "progressive" change which was brought about was the addition of those high-stepping majorettes for morale builders at sports events.

Our Junior Class was responsible for many interesting and original dances. For instance, we sponsored some of the Pep Dances, which were extremely popular; the Christmas Dance on December 16 (Do you remember that Mr. Heller raffled off a Christmas tree?) the Rainbow Dance, and together with the Seniors, the Junior-Senior Prom. The Prom was truly a gala affair. It was semi-formal, and it was hard to believe that those "cute chicks" and well-behaved fellows were the bobby soxers and wolves of the day time.

I could go on describing other memorable occasions indefinitely, but perhaps if I just mention them, in *passant* (that's French); a host of your own memories will arise. Remember the Christmas Vespers, the Liberty Life Carnival, the stream of Junior Councillor Dances, the Sorority and Fraternity Dance, the Senior Class of 45's play "Stage Door," the Temple University Conference (to help students choose a vocation), club events, and the home room picnics at the end of the year? You might not have participated in all these school activities, but it is more than probable that you attended some of them.

Now you can realize what part the Junior year played in our high school career. It was the transitional stage of our class, and we may always recall it with a sense of pride, for it was in that year that the whole world, as well as our infinitely smaller high school class, achieved a unity of purpose.

SENIOR

Seniors at last! How we had looked forward (?) to tugging in that large front door, to joyously (I said joyously) plodding up and down three flights of stairs at least twelve or buffteen times a day. Do you think we've regretted it? Don't try to kid yourself—we loved it.

In the Spring of 1945 we organized for our final year together, with George LaSasso who was ably assisted by his fellow officers. After we had rattled our way into school on the first day—carefully side-stepping the thundering nerd of Sophomores—the usual homeroom officers were elected, and we were off with an atomic start.

On Friday nights practically everyone went to the Pep Dances sponsored by our class, and Saturday found the faithful seniors boisterously helping themselves to a slice of football success, the favorite Fall stimulant. The eve of Turkey Day gave us a chance to leave off excess steam for we held a combination parade, bonfire, and dance which climaxed weeks of anticipation for the "crown clinching" game. Then the day was here! . . . and we were heard to exclaim as they drove out of sight, "Just wait until next year." Well, December came along, and so did the last warning to get Cauldron cuts in on time. P. S. We did.

Before sorrowfully (!!) closing our books for Christmas vacation, the beautifully stirring Vespers were presented, and we helped to usher in a successful basketball season.

With noses intermittently down to the grindstone, we all looked forward to the excitement of the annual Sweetheart Dance and in the meanwhile let our minds wander to fond thoughts of tryouts. You know, tryouts! For three years we had waited for our chance, and now it was here. The cast was chosen, and Harriet, our senior play, was proclaimed a magnificent accomplishment. The excitement died down, we dropped grease paint, wigs, right and left and finally relaxed our weary, little (?) minds with baseball and track. Each time a Senior opened his "facial cavity" or "that through which he reveals all he knows" (mouth to you), college board exams or news of the Glee Club Musical sallied forth.

In a flurry of gown measurements and Class Day, we saw our High School days drawing to a significantly triumphal close. It didn't seem possible that three years could be climaxed in a few days, but that's what it was for us. Although we had willingly looked forward to this day, now that it was here, who could help but feel a pang of sudden rebellion against leaving the many things which we had known and loved. No matter how far we travel, no matter where we may go, we shall never forget the teachers, the classmates, the friendly echoing halls of Liberty High. Yes, how true are the words, "Bethlehem High School, hail to thee, loyal sons and daughters we. In the future as the past, we'll be loyal to the last."

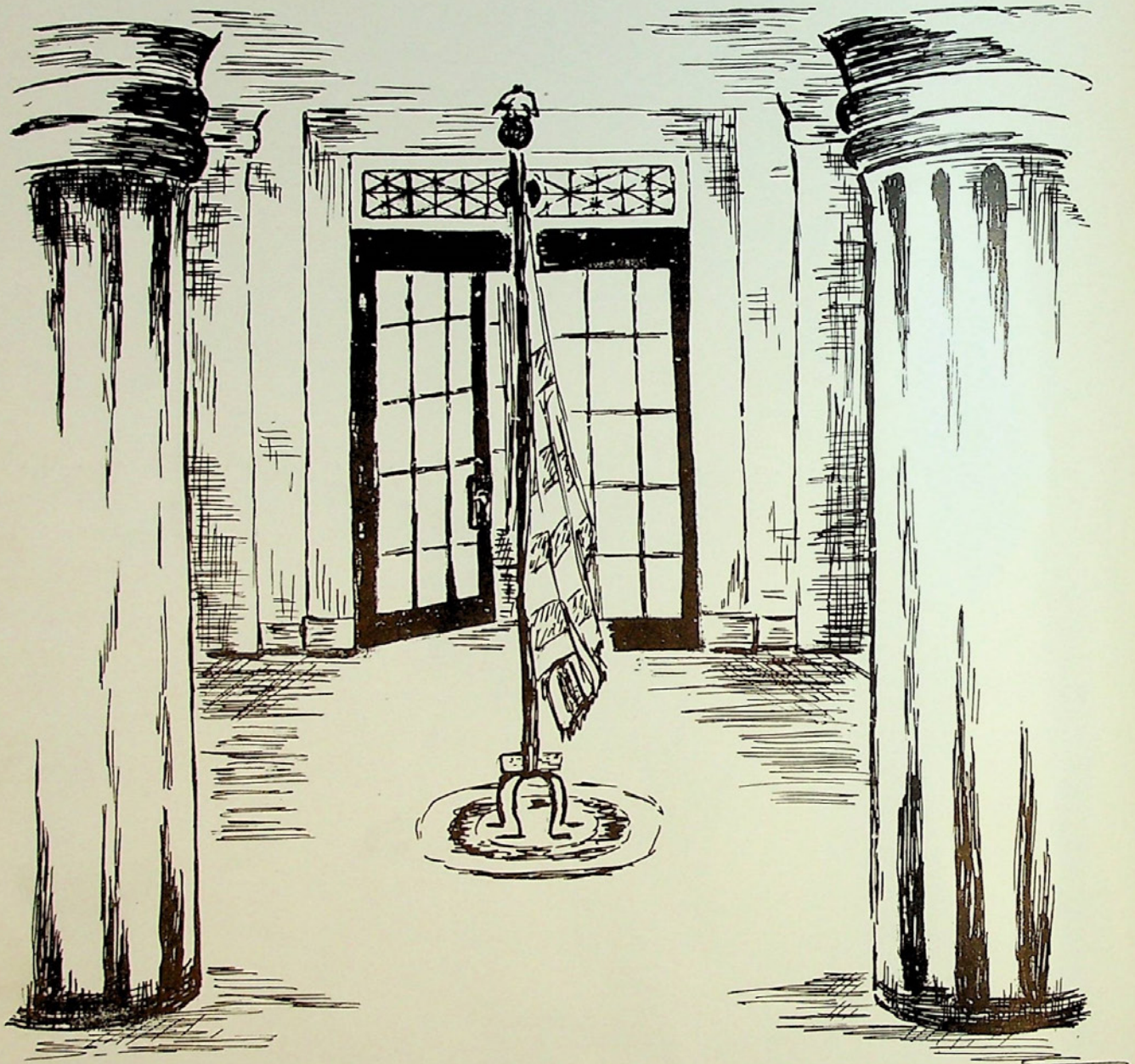

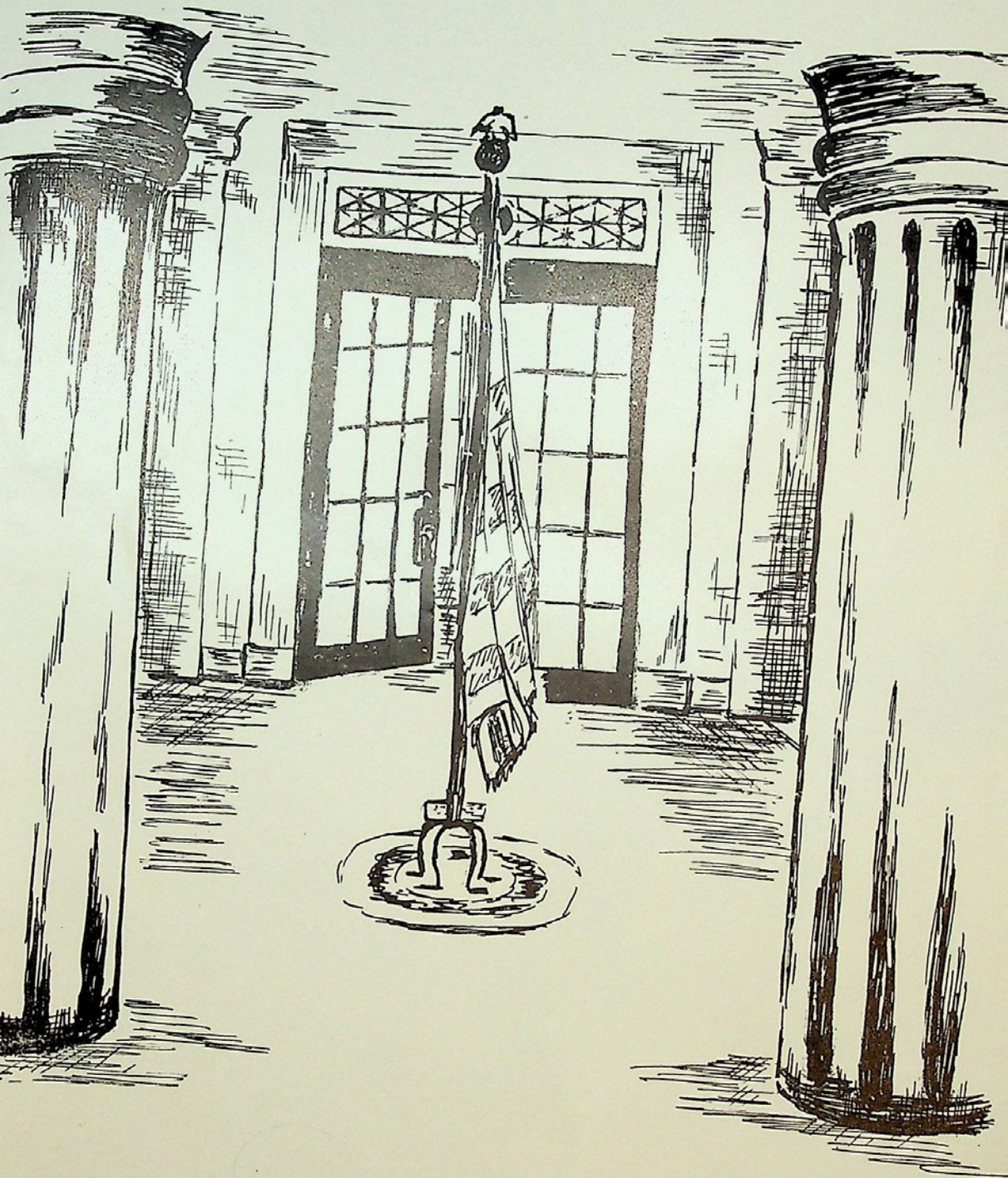
