L. M. Fraivillig Commissioned Army Captain

Leonard M. Fraivillig, assistant city engineer of City of Bethlehem, has been commissioned a captain in the United States Army, final word of his acceptance being received their morning. Mr. Fraivillig will leave Saturday to go to Fort Custer, Mich., where he will attend the Provost-Marshall General's School.

He will remain at Custer for 30 days and will then be assigned to pursue his studies further at a university. Mr. Fraivillig will continue his campaign for re-election to the board of school directors.

The new army officer is a graduate of Bethlehem High and of Lehigh University with a degree in Civil Engineering. He is at present assistant city engineer and assistant engineer for the Bethlehem Water Authority. He resides with his wife and three children at 1410 Lenox Avenue.

Active in civic matters, Mr. Fraivillig has served as school director, filling the unexpired term of Donald Sawyer, now with the U. S. Navy; as State director for the Lehigh Valley Section of the Pennsylvania Society of Professional Engineers and is a past president of the society. He is past president of the Lehigh Valley Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers; past president of the Monocacy Parent-Teacher Association and presently representative to the Central Council of Parents and Teachers from Monocacy P.-T. A.

Mr. Fraivillig is also a member of the committee for Troop 27, Boy Scouts of America, and was formerly Pennsylvania district chairman of the Boys' and Girls' Work Committee of Kiwanis International. He is an active member of Kiwanis and has served on the board of directors. He has taken a part in civilian defense activities in Bethlehem, also, and served as plotting officer at the control center. He's a member of a number of fraternal and social organizations.

Mrs. Fraivillig, a former teacher in the city schools, will remain here for the present.
