## Lehigh Draft Board 1 to Send 44 to Services

Among 58 men accepted for the various armed services at the Allentown Induction Center yesterday were forty-four men from Lehigh County Board No. 1, with headquarters in Emmaus.

About 20 per cent of the men sent by Lehigh Board No. 1 were married men with children, which is regarded as a small percentage in comparison with the number to be called by other boards in the county in succeeding days.
