## Sgt. Johnson Wounded In German Action

Sgt. Rodney G. Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. John L. Johnson, 133 East High Street, was wounded in action in Germany, according to a message received from the War Department by his wife, the former Ruth Schick.

Sgt. Johnson has been awarded the Purple Heart and Infantry Combat Badge and is in his fourth year in service. He received his training in the anti-aircraft branch at Fort Eustis, Va.

He served overseas 18 months then was returned to Camp Stewart, Ga., and transferred to the infantry. He was a member of General Hodges' 69th Division, 273rd Infantry, attached to the First Army, which just a few days ago were the first to greet the Russians in Germany.

Before entering the service he was employed by Bethlehem Steel Company.
