course at the American School Center somewhere in England. Nurses who have proved outstanding in ability and leadership in the European Theater of Operations are selected to attend the course, believed to be the only one of its kind in the American Army.

in the American Army. Of the 180 hours' instruction, only 33 are devoted to nursing subjects and 28 to medical subjects. In the other 119 hours of training, the nurses learn to drill, to render mines and booby-traps harmless, to make river crossings, to interpret military maps, to do military sketching and to learn many things a field soldier must know.
