

Jacob Saemmer Dies On Leyte, Relatives Hear

An official telegram, received last evening, informed Mrs. Marie Saemmer, of 730 Ontario Street, that her son, Pfc. Jacob A. Saemmer, was killed on January 1, in action on Leyte.

A memorial mass will be celebrated at 10:30 a. m., on Sunday, February 11, in Holy Ghost Church.

An invitation has been extended to relatives and friends.

Inducted into the armed forces on September 7, 1942, he received his preliminary training at Ft. McClellan and was subsequently sent to the South Pacific theater of operations and the sent to the se the South Pacific theater of operations, participating in the invasion of the Marshall Islands and other major engagements. He was later transferred to Hawaii, and after a rest period, he was among the Americans participating in the invasion of Leyte.

He is survived by his mother, a brother, Pvt. John Saemmer, "somewhere in France," and a sister, Mrs. Anna Keating, Bethlehem. His father, John Saemmer, died last August.
