Local Navy Man Guard at Yalta During "Big Three" Conference

In a letter received today by Mr. and Mrs. James L. Broughal, of 742 Pawnee Street, from their son, Petty Officer Second Class Lawrence J. Broughal, he informed them that he had the good fortune to be one of the guards at the Yalta palace, the scene of the recent meeting of Roosevelt, Churchill and Stalin. This is the first letter received from him in more than six weeks.

He has been in Uncle Sam's Navy for 32 months, spent 11 months of duty in the North Atlantic, and par-

ticipated in the D-Day invasion and the invasion of southern France.

He is a graduate of Liberty High School and was a member of one of Bill Emery's track teams. Prior to entering the armed forces, he was an employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company.

A brother, Petty Officer First Class James L. Broughal, Jr., is in his country's service for the past 38 months. A radio gunner on a Liberator, he saw service in the South Atlantic, Carribean and Mediterranean theaters of operation.
