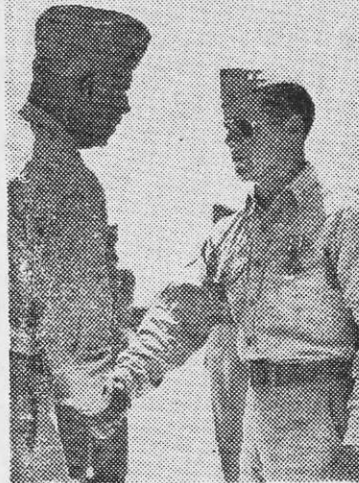


Wins D. F. C.
