Pvt. Stephen A. Sandor Waiting for Discharge

INDIANTOWN GAP—Pvt. Stephen A. Sandor of 1147½ East Fourth Street, Bethlehem, will soon be honorably discharged from the Army at the Separation Center at Indiantown Gap Military Reservation after more than four years of service.

He served in England, France and Belgium and was awarded the ETO Ribbon with three battle stars. Prior to his entry into the service he was employed as a mechanic by the Bethlehem Steel Corp.

Pvt. Sandor belonged to the 28th Division, sometimes known as the "Bloody Bucket"—a Pennsylvania division recognized by its keystone insignia. In middle December of 1944, the 28th bore the brunt of the German counter attack in the Ardennes when nine enemy divisions were thrown against them. By early January, however, they were again ready for action although the German radio had earlier declared them "wiped out."
