Weissport Soldier Had Narrow Escape From Death

Corporal Woodrow Walck, of Weissport, narrowly escaped death in an unusual accident which claimed the life of an unidentified companion near Pittsburg, Cal.

Corporal Walck, son of Mr. and Mrs. Solomon Walck, White Street, was pinned against the side of a building for 15 minutes by a large truck which figured in a head-on collision with an automobile. He escaped with deep cuts on both legs above the knee. His companion was crushed against the wall and was killed instantly.

It was during a blackout that Walck and another soldier were standing near a building when a truck and a car crashed head-on. The driver lost control and pinned the men against the structure.

After discharge from the hospital, Corporal Walck spent a 15-day furlough at home to recuperate, returning to Camp Stoneman this week.
