Bethlehem Soldier Held Prisoner By Italians

A prisoner of the Italian government, Paul J. Falatek, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Falatek, 520 Adams Street, is a patient in a military hospital at Caserta, Italy, according to word from the War Department at Washington.

About three weeks ago in a telegram from the War Department, the parents of the young man were notified that he was reported missing.

Inducted into the armed forces in February, 1942, he received his basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga., later being transferred to Indiantown Gap, and thence to England. He was graduated from SS. Cyril and Methodius parochial school and attended Liberty High School. Before his induction he was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company.

May 19, 1943
