Lt. Col. Galloway Gets Bronze Star On Italian War Front

WITH THE FIFTH ARMY, ITALY—Lieutenant Colonel James M. Galloway of Bethlehem, Pa., a staff officer in an anti-aircraft artillery brigade on the Fifth Army front in Italy, has been awarded the Bronze Star.

The decoration was presented by the commanding general of the brigade who praised Col. Galloway for his energy, zeal, judgment and exceptional perception of tactical situations.

From March, 1943 to June, 1944, Colonel Galloway, with his intimate knowledge of anti-aircraft tactics, protected combat zones and vital areas in North Africa, Sicily and Italy from possible enemy air activity. In the drive through Rome, his plans were successful, despite swiftly changing situations.

The colonel's wife, Mrs. Dorothy H. Galloway, resides at 233 East Garrison Street, Bethlehem. He was originally a member of Bethlehem's Unit, Company C, 213th Coast Artillery, (A.A.), Pennsylvania National Guard. He was ex-
