### Pfc. S. Werkheiser, Nazareth, Killed In German Action

Pfc. Stanley R. Werkheiser, 203 East Center Street, Nazareth, was killed in action February 21 in Germany, according to a War Department telegram received by his wife. He had previously been reported missing on that date.

Pfc. Werkheiser entered the Army on January 11, 1944, and was stationed at Camp Croft, S. C., Camp Shelby, Miss., and Camp Meade, Md., before being sent overseas last July.

He had been wounded on September 10 in Metz, France, and had spent several months in hospitals recovering from the shrapnel wound in his arm. He was awarded the Purple Heart at that time. In January he received the Expert Infantryman's Combat Badge.

Prior to entering the service, he was employed by the Lone Star Cement Company, Nazareth.

He is survived by his wife, the former Catherine Stout of Nazareth, two children, Richard, 9, and
