## Thomas L. Marshall With Fleet Hospital As Nip War Ends

Thomas L. Marshall, Pharmacist's Mate 2/C, was helping carry on the work of Fleet Hospital at Guam, whose foundation was laid in jungle thickets infested by the Japs, when word of the war's end reached there.

Ph. M 2/C Marshall and other hospital attendants continued their work through the Iwo Jima and Okinawa campaigns and while their hospital was still in construction, the first patients were received. These were the sick and injured from Navy and Marine forces based on the Island. They received their first casualties on February 28, from ships which brought the patients from the bloody island of Iwo.
