Gets Bronze Star

Corporal Philip A. Trimble, 533 Ontario Street, has been awarded the Bronze Star for "heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an armed enemy."

The citation accompanying the award read in part, "Trimble at once volunteered to go forward to assist in caring for the wounded. In full view of the enemy and in the midst of artillery and mortar fire, he rode in an open vehicle to the air station. There he worked almost continuously from late morning of November 8 until early morning November 10 helping to evacuate litter cases, and dragging wounded men from the hillside to foxholes, where he gave them first aid."

Trimble has served 28 months overseas in combat duty and participated in the invasions of Africa, Tunisia, Sicily, France and Germany. He was inducted March 21, 1941, and received his training at Fort Benning, Ga., and at Camp Blanding, Fla.
