Stephen W. Kozul, of Steel City, who is now in North Africa, they are exceedingly welcome.

"We are always interested in who are moving up and what they knowing about the boys and girls are doing," Corp. Kozul writes in a letter to Robert E. Scheetz, of the township division of the Saucon Valley Defenders, an organization which strives to keep in constant touch with each of the men and women who have gone forth from that area. The township list now contains 210 names, 24 having been added during the past month.

Corp. Kozul in his most recent letter says he has been getting mail from friends and relatives "by the dozens" and that he is finding it difficult to keep up with the replies. He also tells of having recently met Lieutenant George Savitske, also a Sauconite who is now on the African front, and who was his sergeant when he was still in the States.

Another Saucon Valley service man, Stephen Holler, has returned home, having been mustered out in order to take up work in a defense plant. He is over the 38-year mark. He has been located at a western air force camp attached to a demolition and rescue unit.
